

#### Club Runner for Clubs to access

Changes to Club membership need to 6 be input to Club Runner. It will flow up to RI as long as your club is synched with RI. Information input to My Rotary at RI does not flow down to Club Runner, so you still have to enter them into Club Runner.

If your club does not pay for a Club Runner website, you will use the District website at www.Rotary5930.org. Click on "Member Access" from main page. At top click on "For Clubs" and then you will be able to enter any changes to membership and your club officers.

If needed, I can give you the logon and temporary password to get access.

## ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKLIST FOR ROTARY CLUB - END OF YEAR DISTRICT 5930

It is the end of another successful District 5930 Rotary year. Here are some things your club need to be doing between now and June 30, 2021.

*Membership:* Cleanup Club Central. Delete members that are no longer in the club and add any new members. Complete ideally by end of May or mid-June. Note that whoever you have listed on July 1<sup>st</sup> is how many you will be billed dues. Also, be sure to update members information if there has been changes.

*Ignite:* Update your data on the Ignite program and send to Luis Cavazos to show your accomplishments this year. (luis.cavazos@geffinancial.com)

*R.I. Goals:* Go into My Rotary at rotary.org and input updates on your goals and service projects. If you were unable to complete a service project, delete it from the goals. You have to complete the goals by June 30<sup>th</sup> in order for your club to get recognition for accomplishments this last year.

*Goals for 2021-2022:* Incoming Club Presidents should input their Goals into My Rotary by June 27<sup>th</sup>. A budget should be drafted and presented to your Board at your first Board meeting in the new Rotary year.

Club Officers for 2021-2022: All of your officers for next year should already be input to Club Runner. But, unfortunately, we have 20 clubs that have not completed this requirement. I have sent an individual email to the Area AG's requesting they contact those clubs who still need to input their officers to Club Runner. As a reminder, we will have to roll over the officers if they fail to elect new ones. RI requires a minimum of President, President-Elect, Secretary and Treasurer to be notated in order to be a Rotary Club. Thank you to the following Area's for having all their clubs having completed this requirement: Area 6 – AG Maria Castillo; Area 7 – AG Charles Clements; and Area 11 – AG Lupita Zepeda.

*District Grants:* Grants your club received for 2020-2021 should have the final information input to Club Runner and closed by May 31, 2021. Requests for grants for 2021-2022 should be submitted by June 30, 2021.

District 2020-2021 Awards: You have until June 30, 2021 to complete all actions to qualify for District and RI Awards. A form for each award is posted on the District website. Submission will be June 30, 2021. Note – putting in timely Club Officers and goals are a requirement to receive awards.

## ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKLIST FOR ROTARY CLUB – END OF YEAR

New RI Club Award: District 5930 has a Most Impactful Project of the Year Award will recognize small, medium and large clubs that have successfully developed and implemented at least one significant project during 2020-2021. The project must have been funded in part by the Rotary Foundation. More information is available on District website. Nominations are due November 15, 2021.

District Assembly: The yearly assembly will be done virtually this year. Part 1 will be Saturday, May 15<sup>th</sup> from 9am to 12:30. It will cover Foundation and Grant Certification. Part 2 will be Saturday, May 22 from 9am to 12:45. It will cover Membership/Ignite; Rotary Leadership Institute; and Club Administration. All incoming Club officers should attend both sessions. All Rotarians are invited and encourage new members to attend to learn more about Rotary. There is no charge for this training. Zoom link to meeting will be sent to all Rotarians on Wednesday, May 19<sup>th</sup>.

- 2. BEFORE June 30, 2021, click on "Pay or view your club invoice" to review list of members for RI dues, payment due 7/1/2021. To edit member roster, visit with Club Secretary to update members in ClubRunner or directly with RI.
- 3. BEFORE June 30, 2021, work with your club President to develop a club budget. Under *Resources & reference*, see link to *Budget Worksheet* for a template.
- 4. Under How to Prepare, Click on Learning Center (in blue)

You are now in the Learning Center. Type "treasurer" in the search box, and enter. You should find the "Club Treasurer Basics" learning course.

Together we can follow a path to a stronger, more effective, and vibrant year. At the center of the effort is our Action Plan that will help us become the Rotary we want to be, and the Rotary our communities need us to be.

The Action Plan builds on the extraordinary abilities we have developed in our own professional lives and careers, and it plays to our strengths as leaders, presidents, and committees.

To create our plan, we looked at data, foundation giving, membership projections, and emerging social trends. We assessed what it would take to move from where we are now to where we want to be. Our Action Plan is ambitious, and attainable in a time of extraordinary challenges.

QUESTIONS
