# Objective

- Offer an event where clubs can showcase their local or international projects to clubs that don't have any or want to support other projects to help communities in need.
- This event is open to Global and District Grants, or inter-club participation.
- Promote and create friendship and develop further collaboration between clubs from around the world.
- Help small and /or new Rotary Clubs get involved in International Projects. Learn how District and Global Grants work and can help them with their community projects.
- Partnership with clubs to leverage Rotary Foundation to maximize funding possibilities for projects. In some cases, this may lead to completion of a project that otherwise could not be completed because of lack of funding.



# Accomplishments

- In our second edition, we adapted to new challenges, presenting our first Virtual Project Fair with great effort and motivation to provide a platform to showcase projects and continue supporting Rotary Clubs to help our worldwide communities in need.
- We received 150 Projects but only 148 complied with our requirements.
- Projects received were from different countries as: Canada, USA, Mexico, Belize, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, Panama, Dominican Republic, Colombia, Venezuela, Peru, Argentina, Chile, Australia, Nigeria, Ukraine, India, Roatan, Kalabambougos Mali.
- 12 days of projects presentations and Keynote speakers







# Supported Projects



- Acquisition and commissioning of a used Linear Accelerator to be installed in Bolivar, Venezuela. Project cost \$370,099.00 Dlls. To service 1,200 patients per month. (p1) With the participation of our District 5930
- Virtual Learning Environments to help educate children with disabilities (Spina Bifida) in Colombia. Project cost \$43,000.00. Direct benefit to 85 children. (p2) With the participation of our District 5930
- Sanitary Landfill. Guatemala. Project Cost \$535,000.00. Direct impact of more than 14,118 population (p3) With the participation of District 7080 from Canada
- Together we owe life and hope to children and teenagers with cancer. Project cost \$190,000. Children benefited 468 and their families (p3) With the participation of Rotary Club of Brownsville Sunrise

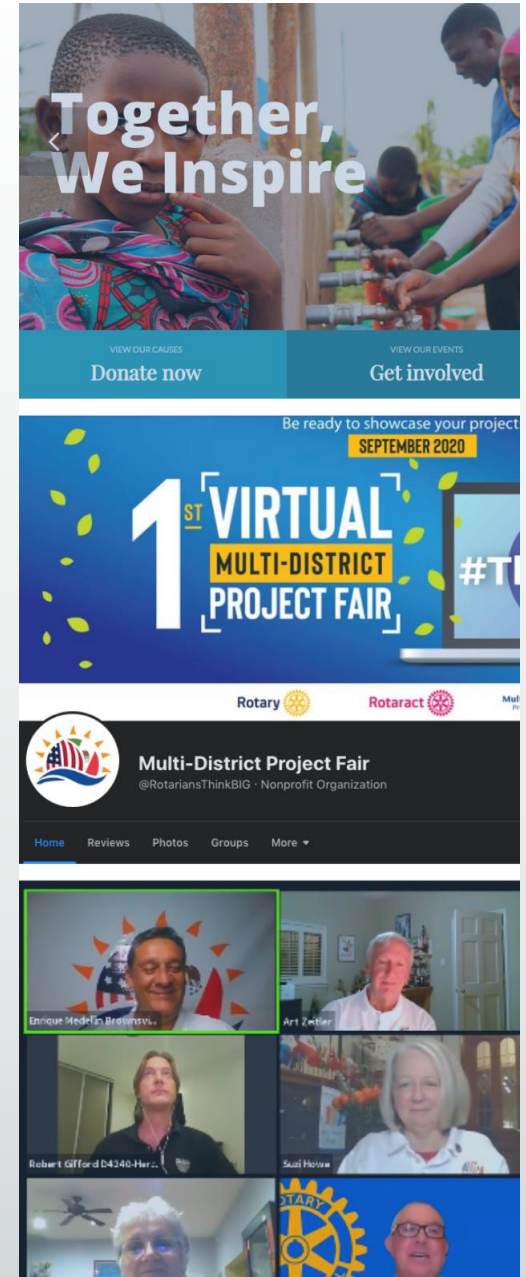
