## Individual Project Report Wheelchair Ramp Project

## **Project Description**

1. Describe the project. What was done, when, and where did the project activities take place?

Five Wheel Chair Ramps were completed.

- (3) 1018 McClendon, Corpus Christi on Saturday, 12-15-18.

- (5) 1713 Karen, Corpus Christi on Saturday, 3-9-19.
- 2. How many people benefited from this project?

Five low income families with a disabled person in each family. One was a child, one a middle age woman who was in a car accident, and three elderly persons.

3. Who were the beneficiaries, how were they impacted by this project, and what humanitarian need was met?

All these disabled individuals were in wheel chairs and unable to exit their home due to porch steps. The family members had to carry out their wheel chair and then carry them out of the house to the wheel chair. The families could not afford to have a ramp built. The names were provided to our club by the Corpus Christi of homes needing a wheel chair ramp built.

- 5. What did they do? Please give at least two examples, not including financial support provided to the project. Three of the Ramp projects had family members help build the Ramp. On each ramp, a Rotarian went to their home several days prior to discuss logistics with the family of where to place the ramp. In some cases, it included having to move fence and lawn ornaments, along with removing the steps to the porch. They allowed our builders into their home to use facilities and on one very hot day to cool off.
- 6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

The Rotoract club of TX A&M-CC provided students to help build the ramps. The Interact club of John Paul High School provided students to help build. They also posted their sign showing the club was participating. Both clubs wore their club T-shirt's advertising Rotary.
